

February 13, 2023, 7:00 P.M., Greenfield Township Municipal Building, a regular meeting of the Greenfield Township Board of Supervisors.

Present: Sal Fedele, Kevin Bartlett, Brian Brown, Renee Wagner, Joseph Heslop and Paul Hollman. Sal Fedele attended by the meeting by Zoom. Kevin Bartlett conducted the meeting. Kevin Bartlett stated that Public Comment would be accepted throughout the meeting as items were being discussed and before each vote.

Sal Fedele made a motion to approve the January 3, 2023 minutes as presented. Brian Brown seconded. No public comment was made. Motion carried unanimously.

The Treasurer's Report was reviewed.

Joe Heslop reported that the roads were being plowed when necessary, the crew was filling potholes, the roads were being graded and the road plane was being used. The roads are in horrible condition due to the changing weather.

Brian Brown made a motion to approve Resolution 2023-5 setting snow removal expenses as the County Liquid Fuels project. This had been previously approved by motion at the December 12, 2022 meeting, but now PennDOT was requiring a Resolution. Sal Fedele seconded. No public comment was made. Motion carried unanimously.

Brian Brown made a motion to allow the Greenfield Township Volunteer Fire Company to piggyback on the Erie Area Council of Government three-year fuel bid. The required paperwork had been submitted. Sal Fedele seconded. No public comment was made. Motion carried unanimously.

Quantities for materials were reviewed and approved for bid through the Erie Area Council of Government, Harborcreek Township and COSTARS.

Brian Brown made a motion to adopt Resolution 2023-6 approving the posting of a ten-ton weight limit on all Township roads, with the exception of Wilson Rod in Little Hope and Delmas Drive. The posting will be effective February 15, 2023 and will remain in effect until removed. Sal Fedele seconded. No public comment was made. Motion carried unanimously. The 2023 Agility Work Plan with PennDOT was approved. The plan was 50 hours of State road intersection mowing in exchange for 1200 tons of millings. Kevin Bartlett signed the Plan.

Kevin Bartlett made a motion to approve application to the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources and the Hirtzel Foundation for a multi-use court for the Greenfield Community Park. Brian Brown seconded. No public comment was made. Motion carried unanimously.

A Zoning permit was reviewed.

No subdivisions were presented.

Planning Commission minutes were reviewed.

Kevin Bartlett reported that the fundraiser dates for 2023 had been set and were presented for insurance purposes. The grant for the engine was not funded. The call volume is as active as it has been for the past years. A letter was received from Perry Highway Hose Company stating that they would not be responding for mutual aid calls. This will not have any impact on Greenfield Township.

Nothing to report on the Zoning Ordinance Amendments and Public Comment Resolution.

A letter had been mailed to Christopher Dallas regarding a violation of the Holding Tank

Ordinance.

Sections of the Hazard Mitigation Plan were being emailed for review and approval. Kurt Sundberg has been in correspondence with Spectrum regarding the cable franchise agreement.

No new business was presented.

No interest in schools or seminars.

The wording of a section of the Fall/Winter newsletter, regarding funding of the Fire Company, budget expenditures, and fund balances, was discussed. The newsletter will be emailed to the Supervisors for their approval before sending to print.

No Final Public Comment was made.

Sal Fedele made a motion to pay the invoices as presented, Northwest 3819 through 3834, PLGIT 11354 through 11405, and all ACH approvals had been documented. This includes all invoices paid in January. Brian Brown seconded. No public comment was made. Motion carried unanimously.

Sal Fedele made a motion to adjourn. Brian Brown seconded. No public comment was made. Motion carried unanimously.
