

May 11, 2026, 6:00 P.M., Greenfield Township Municipal Building, a regular meeting of the Greenfield Township Board of Supervisors.

Present: Kevin Bartlett, Brian Brown, Travis Clabatz, Renee Wagner, Joe Heslop, Carl D. Rupp and Ralph Burlingham.

Kevin Bartlett stated that Public Comment would be taken as permitted in the Public Comment Resolution - All residents and taxpayers of Greenfield Township in attendance at the meeting shall have a reasonable opportunity to comment on matters on the agenda for the meeting and/or matters of concern, official action and/or deliberation which are or may be before the Board of Supervisors prior to the Board of Supervisors taking official action.

Brian Brown made a motion to adopt the minutes from the April 13th and April 29th meetings.

Travis Clabatz seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

The Treasurer's Report was reviewed.

Joe Heslop reported that three of the crew members had attended the Dirt & Gravel Roads training. Spring clean up days were held. The crew had been hauling millings from the back lot to the side lot for screening, screening millings, ditching as needed, running the grader and road plane as needed and able, and reinstalled the Merry Go All at the Park. Bags of garbage were left on Prindle Road. Someone had dumped 122 tires on the curve of Prindle Road, and a lot of them were race tires. The beavers were still causing issues on German Road. Joe Heslop stated that the frost had come out of most areas on the roads, and the posting could be lifted.

Brian Brown made a motion to adopt Resolution 2026-12 removing the 10-ton weight limit on Township roads. Travis Clabatz seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

The rental of the gravel screen from Hull Excavating was approved by the Board.

Kevin Bartlett reported that he was able to remove the bearings on the Merry Go All. Bearings were purchased from ErieTec and installed by the crew. The cost of the new bearings was \$ 300.00 versus the recommendation of the manufacturer to replace the whole apparatus at the estimate of \$ 6,900.00.

It was reported that PennDOT bermed the State Roads, fixing two areas that flooded the State roadways.

The Hirtzel Grant application for the installation of security cameras at the Greenfield Community Park has tentatively been approved. Formal notification will be forwarded soon. Zoning permits were reviewed. Ralph Burlingham questioned whether a detail shop would be a permitted use for his property in the Mixed Use zoning district in Little Hope. Renee Wagner stated that it would be permitted.

Nothing to report from the Planning Commission.

No Subdivisions were presented.

Kevin Bartlett reported that the Fire Company was moving closer to construction of the new fire station.

Nothing to report on the Zoning Ordinance Amendments

Pictures had been forwarded to Attorney Kurt Sundberg to prepare Nuisance Ordinance friendly letters and violation notices as decided after the inspection by the Board.

No new business was presented.

Carl Rupp requested that deer crossing signs be installed on Route 89. This is a PennDOT road. He was told to contact PennDOT, as it is their responsibility. Carl Rupp inquired about

State or Federal grants for the removal of invasive species. He was told that Erie County Conservation would have information on that issue. Carl Rupp reported that water was running down Wakley Road and Old Route 89. The Board stated that once the road dries out, it will be reshaped with the grader.

No interest in schools or seminars.

No questions on Correspondence.

No Final Public Comment was given.

Kevin Bartlett made a motion to pay the invoices as presented, Northwest 4570 through 4583, PLGIT 12312 through 12329. The ACH payments as approved through the month were documented. Brian Brown seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Kevin Bartlett made a motion to adjourn. Brian Brown seconded. Motion carried unanimously.
