

July 13, 2026, 6:00 P.M., Greenfield Township Municipal Building, a regular meeting of the Greenfield Township Board of Supervisors.

Present: Kevin Bartlett, Brian Brown, Renee Wagner, Joe Heslop and Carl D. Rupp. Travis Clabbatz was absent.

Kevin Bartlett stated that Public Comment would be taken as permitted in the Public Comment Resolution - All residents and taxpayers of Greenfield Township in attendance at the meeting shall have a reasonable opportunity to comment on matters on the agenda for the meeting and/or matters of concern, official action and/or deliberation which are or may be before the Board of Supervisors prior to the Board of Supervisors taking official action.

Brian Brown made a motion to adopt the minutes from the June 15th meeting. Kevin Bartlett seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

The Treasurer's Report was reviewed.

Joe Heslop stated that the crew had finished mowing two passes around the Township by July 4th, ditched where needed, graded roads before the rains, hauled 2RC and antiskid for the Township, trenched, laid down geotextile and tailgated 2RC on Morgan Road for the Dirt & Gravel Roads grant, and met with Tom McClure to go over the Morgan Road project. The trencher broke and was taken to Tom Allen to be checked for the possibility of repairing it. Renee Wagner reported that the Township was waiting for the cameras to come in to be installed at the Park, through a grant from the Hirtzel Foundation.

Renee Wagner presented information from the Erie County Planning Roads Funding webinar. The PennDOT Multimodal Grant could consider other road improvement projects if money is leftover after funding Multimodal projects. The Wilson Road experimental millings section was discussed. Wilson Road is a State Turnback road, from Route 89 to Ashton Road. Besides the problems in the milling area, DSA has been added in sections, pipes have been replaced and some tiling has been installed. Full Depth Reclamation with a seal coat was stated as the ultimate treatment for the project. Taking advantage of the assistance from the PennDOT Municipal Services Representative Troy Cyphert may increase the odds of the grant being approved. The Board approved contacting Troy Cyphert for recommendations on a Multimodal Grant application for Wilson Road.

No zoning permits were issued.

Nothing to report from the Planning Commission.

No Subdivisions were presented.

Kevin Bartlett reported that the Fire Company was working through final issues with the requirements of the grant, provided through the Community Project Funding Initiative.

Kurt will be working on the Zoning Ordinance Amendments, Nuisance Ordinance letters, violation notices, and Data Center draft ordinance.

No interest in schools or seminars.

Dillon Foringer has transferred the Township mowing account to Ryan Thornton for the same rates quoted for the remainder of the year.

Carl Rupp questioned the \$ 5.00 Erie County registration fee, stated that the wood cutters appear to be done, but they drug trees on private property and flattened the ridge in the road, stated that rain run off will increase due to the trees being removed, reported on the dollar value of the trees removed, questioned the "registered" use of Elias Attea's properties, and complained about the condition of Larry Magoon's and Sheila Eyajan's properties.

Brian Brown made a motion to pay the invoices as presented, Northwest 4606 through 4617, PLGIT 12358 through 12376. The ACH payments as approved through the month were

documented. Kevin Bartlett seconded. Motion carried unanimously.
Brian Brown made a motion to adjourn. Kevin Bartlett seconded. Motion carried unanimously.
